### JOINT RESOLUTION S20-05 SENATE MEETING February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020

4 TITLE: Declaration of Climate Emergency

5  
6 WHEREAS: Global scale climate change has been scientifically linked to anthropogenic causes by the  
7 Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change scientists<sup>1</sup>, and  
8

9 WHEREAS: The impacts of this climate change can be easily seen globally through wildfires, polar  
10 vortices, droughts, increased storm intensity, flooding, etc., and  
11

12 WHEREAS: Any failure to acknowledge the global implications of climate change is willful ignorance  
13 of indisputable scientific fact, and  
14

15 WHEREAS: Iowa State University of Science and Technology prides itself on scientific discovery and  
16 advancement and markets cutting edge research in many academic fields, and  
17

18 WHEREAS: The Climate Commitment Plan adopted by Iowa State Student Government in 2019,  
19 contained goals around creating a university sustainability group, comprised of students  
20 and faculty, that is charged with overseeing the implementation of climate efforts at Iowa  
21 State such as working with campus departments to create a Strategic Plan addressing  
22 climate change and transitioning to 100% renewable electricity by 2035<sup>2</sup>, and  
23

24 WHEREAS: Globally, low-income families spend 50-60% of their household income on food, while  
25 for the wealthiest, it is less than 10% and, due to climate change, food prices will increase  
26 substantially, with predictions like a 23% increase in South Asia and 77% in Sub-Saharan  
27 Africa and, because of this, 100 million low-income people in the poorest countries in the  
28 world will be in poverty by 2030 and will be unable to afford food<sup>3</sup>, and  
29

30 WHEREAS: Climate extremes negatively impact crop and livestock productivity. This is due in part to  
31 increased soil erosion and runoff, and an increase of unwanted pests and pathogens due to  
32 increased temperature and precipitation.<sup>12</sup> With Iowa being an agricultural state, climate  
33 change has an extremely negative impact on our economy, and  
34

35 WHEREAS: Oil and gas companies including bp, Shell, Chevron, and others have acknowledged the  
36 existence of climate change, and have committed to reducing emissions in their

- 37 operations, investing in green infrastructure, growing low carbon offers for customers,  
38 and working with policy makers to design balanced and transparent greenhouse gas  
39 (GHG) emissions reductions policies to address environmental concerns,<sup>4,5,6</sup> and  
40
- 41 WHEREAS: The impending climate crisis is a non- partisan issues with the Department of Defense  
42 under the President Trump administration, as well as the past four administrations, stating  
43 that, “The effects of a changing climate are a national security issue with potential  
44 impacts to Department of Defense missions, operational plans, and installations”,<sup>7</sup> and  
45
- 46 WHEREAS: On July 20th 2019, University of Iowa Student Government passed legislation at the  
47 conference of the Alliance of the Big Ten Schools which led to all of the big ten schools  
48 signing on to declare a climate emergency,<sup>8</sup> and  
49
- 50 WHEREAS: The University of Northern Iowa and the University of Iowa have both declared a climate  
51 emergency within their respective student governments to portray to their students and  
52 university leaders that climate change is a real and immediate threat to the state of Iowa,  
53 and, as a university priding itself in science and technology, Iowa State University must  
54 show its dedication to responding to changing science and technology by declaring a  
55 climate emergency,<sup>9,10</sup> and  
56
- 57 WHEREAS: Over 809 million people are represented by over 1,300 local governments and 25  
58 countries that have declared a Climate Emergency including 75 in the United States<sup>11</sup>, be  
59 it therefore  
60
- 61 RESOLVED: Iowa State University Student Government supports the declaration of a climate  
62 emergency to display that all regent universities in Iowa are concerned and invested in  
63 making a change, and be it further

- 65 RESOLVED: Iowa State University should be committed to reducing fossil fuel use and taking steps to  
66 shut down the coal and natural gas burners at the power plant on campus, and be it further  
67 RESOLVED: Iowa State University create a structured and detailed plan to reach carbon neutrality as  
68 soon as possible, and be it further  
69  
70 RESOLVED: Iowa State University works with local, county, and state community members and  
71 stakeholders to strategically set feasible goals and plans of action to combat climate  
72 change.  
73  
74 RESOLVED: Iowa State University should commit to educating students and faculty about climate  
75 change through expert panels, presentations, campus-wide sustainability events, and  
76 reforming curriculum to include a required sustainability course. And be it further  
77  
78 RESOLVED: This Declaration of Climate Emergency will be sent to President Wendy Wintersteen, the  
79 Board of Regents, Dr. Bill Gutowski, the University Sustainability Committee, the  
80 Sustainability Advisory Committee, and the Student Government.
